**REQUEST: CLG Review Mount Calvary Church Nomination, 800 North Eutaw Street, to the National Register of Historic Places**

**PETITIONER(S): Maryland Historical Trust**

**OWNER: Mount Calvary Roman Catholic Church Congregation, Inc.**

**SIGNIFICANCE:** Represents a stage of the early development of Gothic Revival architecture in which architects handled med-evil motifs freely. It incorporates vernacular brick architectural traditions of Baltimore with both German and Italianate elements.

**RECOMMENDATION: Meets National Register Criteria A, B and C. Consideration A.**

**Criteria for Evaluation**

- a. That are associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history; or
- b. That are associated with the lives of significant persons in or past; or
- c. That embody the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, or method of construction, or that represent the work of a master, or that possess high artistic values, or that represent a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction; or

- a. A religious property deriving primary significance from architectural or artistic distinction or historical importance; or
